ANNUAL LEASE AGREEMENT

The reorganization of the Lodge and the formation of the Reno Elks Lodge No. 597 Home Company (the "Home Company") as a Nevada nonprofit corporation treated as a 501 (c) (2) title-holding organization for federal income tax purposes was previously approved by the vote of the Lodge's members. Finalizing the Lodge's reorganization and capitalizing the Home Company for its intended purpose, certain assets of the Lodge were transferred by the Lodge to the Home Company. In this regard, Lodge member approval and a permit from the Board of Grand Trustees was submitted and approved on October 30, 2023.

At the Lodge meeting dated June 8, 2023, members voted and approved of the following matters in connection with the Lodge's reorganization and the Lodge transferring assets to the Home Company as recommended by the Lodge Board of directors:

1. The transfer of title from the Lodge to the Home Company with respect to the Lodge's land, buildings, fixtures and other improvements to the Lodge's land, certain equipment and the cash and securities held in the Lodge's investment account.
2. The assignment of the cell tower lease with American Tower Corporation from the Lodge to the Home Company
3. The Lodge entering into a lease with the Home Company for the Lodge's continued use and occupancy of the real property transferred by the Lodge to the Home Company and Lodge's continued use and occupancy of the real property transferred by the Lodge to the Home Company and Lodge's continued use of the tangible personal property transferred by the Lodge to the Home Company.

The transaction documents proposed related to the foregoing are available at the Secretary's office.

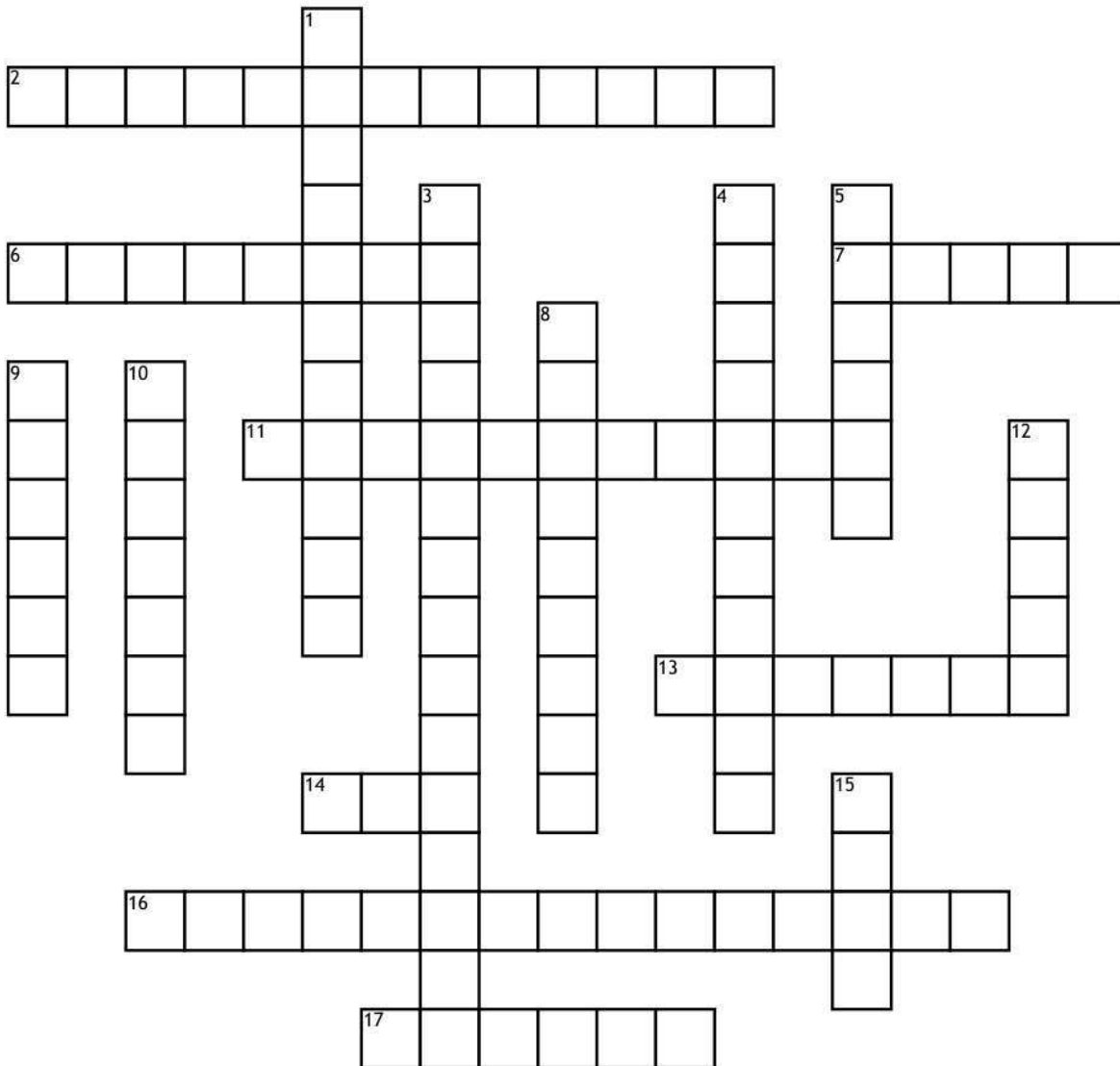

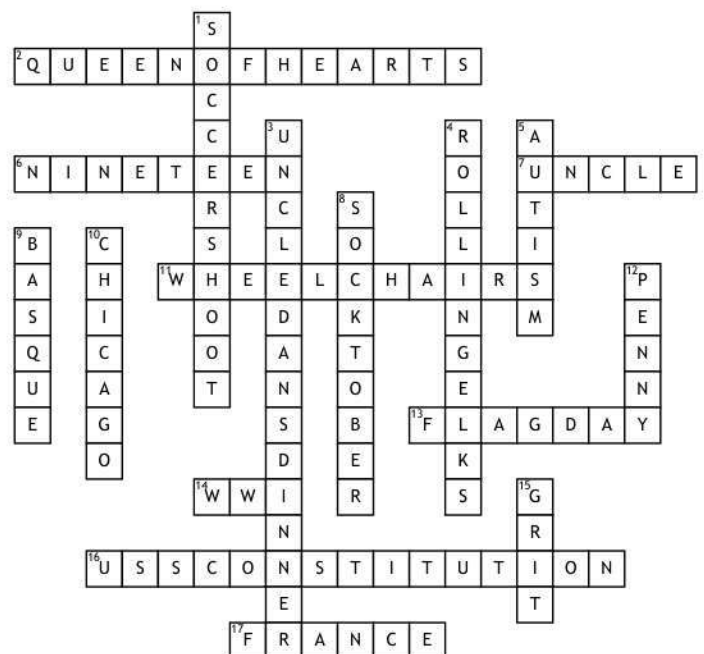

PROGRESS IS AFOOT IN THE WOMEN'S ATHLETIC CENTER!

But before we jump into that, please join me in recognizing our outgoing chairperson, **Lanea Warren Meiltoft**. Her vision, energy, and resourcefulness have been instrumental in bringing about a space where Reno Elk women can focus on fitness, friendship, and supporting one another's wellness goals. We are deeply grateful to Lanea and wish her all the best in her future ambitions and dreams.

And now this... Action! Momentum! Progress!

You've waited. You've wondered. You've peeked through the door. You've been patient... some of you have become impatient. Many have asked outright: "Is anything EVER going to happen in there?!" The answer is a resounding YES!

While visible changes are just beginning, a tremendous amount of work has already occurred behind the scenes: planning, coordinating, problem-solving, navigating Lodge procedures, and, of course, A LOT of fundraising.

Our efforts are finally showing:

- Electrical upgrades are complete and ready to handle commercial-grade equipment
- Outdated equipment has been removed, and donated when feasible

- Modern overhead lighting has been installed
- Fresh paint brightens up those previously tired old walls (don't miss the groovy deep purple ceiling!)
- The horse-stall mats have been donated to the very fine folks at Horsemanship For Heroes through coordination with the Veterans Service Committee
- New commercial-grade gym flooring is being installed as I write this article
- Our treadmill and seven sets of dumbbells are on order, with delivery expected by the end of June

Next up: we are only about \$1,500 shy of being able to purchase the second of our two big pieces of exercise equipment - a medical-grade recumbent stepper. This impressive \$7,500.00 machine has already received Lodge approval and will make our gym inclusive for wheelchair users and individuals with other physical challenges.

When the core equipment is all in place (let's not forget about that workhorse of a hoist machine we already have), we'll re-hang our mirrors and mount our already-donated TV once a wall bracket is purchased. After that, we'll focus on a bank of lockers, estimated to cost about \$5,000.

But here's the heart of it—this project has never been just about paint or equipment. The Women's Athletic Center will be a space where Reno Elk women can prioritize their health, connect with one another, and feel welcomed and supported within our Lodge.

So what's taking so long, you've asked? In a word: Money.

Aside from the electrical upgrades, every improvement made—and every improvement still to come—is funded through the hard work of this Committee and the generosity of our fellow Elks and their guests. Every piece of equipment, every flooring tile, every gallon of paint, every finishing touch depends on fundraising and donations. Every time you attend our 3rd Wednesday Bingo & Spaghetti Dinner, you are helping to make our vision a reality. Every entry, bingo card, and raffle ticket purchased moves us one step closer to the finish line.

Want to be part of something lasting? Want to help shape a space that will serve Reno Elk women for years

to come? We would love your time, talent, and treasure. If volunteering isn't on your bingo card right now (see what I did there?), direct donations make a meaningful impact.
